TMC's Brownsville Infant & Toddler Center earns National NAEYC Accreditation

Brownsville, TX – TMC's Infant and Toddler Head Start (MSHS) Center located in Brownsville, TX has earned accreditation from the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) – the nation's leading organization of early childhood professionals. A center's NAEYC Accreditation is a sign that they are a leader in a national effort to invest in high-quality early childhood education and to help give all children a better start.

"We are very excited, earning NAEYC accreditation recognizes our commitment to offering the children we serve the highest quality level of education," stated Rosie Barrientos-Center Manager. "NAEYC Accreditation lets families in the communities we serve know that children in our program are getting the best care and early learning experiences possible," stated Mary Capello-CEO. Approximately 8 percent of all preschools and other early childhood programs in the nation are currently accredited by NAEYC.

To earn NAEYC Accreditation, the Brownsville Infant & Toddler MSHS Center went through an extensive self-study process, measuring the program and its services against the ten new NAEYC Early Childhood Program Standards and more than 400 related Accreditation Criteria. The program received NAEYC Accreditation after an on-site visit by NAEYC Assessors to ensure that the program meets each of the ten NAEYC program standards. NAEYC-accredited programs are also subject to unannounced visits during their accreditation, which lasts for five years. "The new NAEYC Accreditation system raises the bar for preschools, child care centers and other early childhood programs," said Mark Ginsberg, Ph.D., executive director of NAEYC.

Background

As of September 2006, the Association's revised program standards and criteria have introduced a new level of quality, accountability, and service for parents and children in child care programs. The new standards reflect the latest research and best practices in early childhood education and development. NAEYC is committed to utilizing the newest studies and analysis on positive child outcomes to ensure young children continue receiving the highest-quality care and education possible. To earn NAEYC Accreditation, a program must meet each of the ten NAEYC Early Childhood Program Standards. Programs are accredited by NAEYC for a five-year period. The NAEYC Accreditation system was created in 1985 to set professional standards for early childhood education, and to help families identify high-quality preschools, child care centers and other early education programs.
